 - YTD Blotter- As of June 11 the BFPD has responded to 4,648 Calls for Service and generated 351 Case Reports.
 - July 4th planning is in effect. The PD deals with a very high call volume during this week and all the festivities.
 - Vehicle updates: Got the 2022 Dodge Charger from Kansas City, the 2015 Dodge Charger has stopped running earlier than expected.

- **10.36.160 - Where prohibited—Exceptions.**

Commercial vehicles and trailers of all types, including travel, boat, camping and hauling, shall not be parked or stored on any lot occupied by a dwelling or on any lot in any residential district except in accordance with the following provisions:

- A. Not more than one (1) commercial vehicle per family living on the premises, which does not exceed one and one-half (1 ½) tons rated capacity, shall be permitted; and in no case shall a commercial vehicle used for hauling explosives, gasoline or liquefied petroleum products be permitted.
- B. Not more than one (1) camping or travel trailer or hauling trailer or boat trailer per family living on the premises shall be permitted and the trailer shall not exceed twenty-four (24) feet in length, or eight (8) feet in width, and further provided, that the trailer shall not be parked or stored for more than forty-eight (48) hours unless it is located behind the front yard building line. A camping or travel trailer shall not be occupied either temporarily or permanently while it is parked or stored in any area except in a travel trailer court authorized under this Division.
- C. Notwithstanding the other provisions of this ordinance, **a recreational vehicle or camping or travel trailer may be parked on the public roadway between the 1st of May through the second Sunday of September.**
