Greetings from Mayor Randy Schmidt

Here is an update on projects in our city:

Well #3 – Well currently at 2,094 feet, all casing strings and concrete are complete. Drilling of production hole to begin week of February 9, 2025.

11th Avenue Improvements – Phase III – Being engineered. Anticipated 2025 start/completion. Springs Lines Replacement – Phase I preliminary design complete, permanent easements are being completed. Projected start date unknown.

Public Works Outbuilding Roof Repair, Landfill Buildings Roof and Roundup Grounds Buildings Roof Repair are ongoing.

Wayfinder Signs – Phase II – Design ongoing, anticipated 2025 completion. Airport Taxi Lane Reconstruction – Design started, project to be bid mid 2025 for 2026 construction FAA design review complete.

Ballfield ADA Restrooms & Concessions – Construction started, spring 2025 anticipated completion. Sourdough Water Main Loop – Design completed, bid to be awarded February 18, 2025. Additional Public Works Building Repairs – Substantially completed.

Highland Park Skatepark/Roundup Grounds Pump Track – Design ongoing. Rodeo Grounds Drainage Improvements – Contractor hired. Project to start winter 2025. 6th Avenue Improvements – Survey completed, design ongoing and construction in 2026. Harding Street Improvements – Design ongoing, anticipated construction 2025/26. National Street and Omaha Street Overlay – Design kickoff meeting with engineer started, anticipated construction 2025

Code Enforcement

Belle Fourche City Ordinance #12.28.010 states:

It shall be unlawful for a property owner or occupant to permit snow or ice to remain on any sidewalk for more than twenty-four (24) hours after snowfall has ceased. Unless otherwise provided within these ordinances, all sidewalks must provide at least a thirty-six (36) inch wide area free and clear from snow and ice across the subject property.

City Services & Public Works

Make sure to stop at City Hall to get your 2025 four free dump passes. A valid ID is required.

REMINDER ABOUT YOUR GARBAGE SERVICE: Garbage containers need to be out by 7 AM on your scheduled garbage day. When placing your container on the curb please have it facing towards the street. Do not place liquids or ashes in the garbage container. Please have your garbage in tied bags inside the tote and have the lid closed, especially in colder weather, as the lids are more likely to crack. Also, please keep the totes at least 3 feet away from anything including a second tote. All garbage must be in the garbage container for the city to dispose of your garbage. Nothing outside of the tote will be picked up by our driver. The speed limit on the landfill road is 10mph.

Per Ordinance 8.20.030 under section A. Household garbage shall generally consist of kitchen refuse, cans, bottles, paper, crockery, glass, cardboard, household refuse, and other waste materials originating on household premises. Wet garbage must be drained and wrapped.

The following items shall not be considered household garbage: construction materials and debris from construction; anything too large to be placed in a garbage container, cut up trees and limbs and yard waste, flammable substances, regulated hazardous or toxic waste, soil, bricks, concrete, lumber, ashes, sand, gravel, dead animals or carcasses, tires, vehicle or vehicle parts, furniture, household appliances and other heavy bulky materials and all material which is now or may be banned from the landfill by Federal, State, County or City requirements.
